With the newfound status as being federally incorporated, WOHSS will benefit in numerous ways: WOHSS can expand across multiple provinces or territories, federal incorporations are recognized around the world, which is an important consideration if WOHSS ever desires to expand outside Canada, and the prestige of being federally incorporated offers additional credibility to our organization.

Heading into 2024, the Governance and Legal Committee will continue providing advice and guidance, as well as look for opportunities to increase WOHSS' status, any efficiency improvements, and ensure compliance with being federally incorporated.



NOMINATIONS COMMITTEE

The mandate of the Nominations Committee is the recruitment, selection and ongoing development of members of the Board of Directors.

The Membership Committee's mandate is to effectively manage the application and registration activities related to new and current memberships while striving to continually grow the WOHSS membership base.

COMMITTEE ACTIVITIES

In 2023, the Membership Committee focused on continued engagement of existing members whilst supporting activities to attract new members.

436 members were active with WOHSS representing 64 students, 72 associates, and 305 general members.

2024 will be a year focused on increasing WOHSS's membership value proposition through increased development & networking opportunities.



MENTORSHIP COMMITTEE

DANA STAMU I COMMITTEE CHAIR

The Mentorship Committee mandate is to provide members with mentorship opportunities that are not always available to everyone in their place of work. This formal program has been designed with different streams making it accessible to the whole WOHSS network and all members are welcome to join at no additional cost.

The Mentorship Committee paired 38 mentees with 34 mentors in 2023. Similar to the year before, we had more mentees than mentors, and in order to provide support to the mentees that were waiting for a mentor, we organized, with the help of Champions & Events Committee, two speed mentorship sessions where the mentees could interact with mentors in group settings to discuss any topic of interest for them.

One of the committee's goals for 2023 was to collaborate with universities and colleges that offer Health and Safety Programs to provide mentorship and guidance to new safety professionals that are at the beginning of their career. We were able to sign a partnership with Seneca Polytechnic Institute in Ontario for seven mentorship sessions that included online Q&A discussions about the safety profession or first job, resume writing process, mock interviews and an in-person session at the end of the semester. We learned a lot about gaps in our sessions and how to prepare for next year. I want to thank you to all our amazing mentors that took the time to participate in these sessions and provide some of their wisdom to the new generation of safety professionals!

We are looking forward to new initiatives and accomplishments in 2024.

STRATEGIC GOALS FOR 2024

What's next for WOHSS

We are nearing the end of our first 5-year strategic plan (2019-2024) and are excited for our future. One of our goals was to develop a national framework to grow WOHSS across Canada. We reached a significant milestone in this journey earlier this month when The Women in Occupational Health & Safety Society became federally a registered corporation under the Canada Not-for-profit Corporations Act.

We are also really excited about our newly formed partnership with Seneca College in Ontario. Working together we are leveraging our collaborative efforts support the development expertise to individuals who are studying to become practitioners. All Seneca students enrolled in their WSP certificate program are now WOHSS members and we have organized a series of online sessions to help prepare them for their future. Sessions include topics such as "a day in the life of a safety professional", "what to expect in your first safety job", resume writing, and mock interviews.
